Program for September 18, 2014



Presenter: Mary Berkheiser, Professor of Law, Director of Juvenile Justice Clinic

Program: Ms. Berkheiser will talk about a project she and her Juvenile Justice Clinic students are working on this year: establishing a safe harbor for child victims of sex trafficking in Nevada.

Professor Berkheiser earned her J.D. magna cum laude in 1984 from the University of Arizona. She was editor-in-chief of

the Arizona Law Review and earned the Outstanding Senior Award. She was a law clerk to Arizona Supreme Court Justice Stanley Feldman, and spent eight years as an attorney with Meyer, Hendricks, Victor, Osborn & Maledon in Phoenix, Arizona, where she practiced in the areas of employment law, appellate litigation and professional liability defense. She has prosecuted and defended appeals in the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, Arizona Supreme Court, and Arizona Court of Appeals. Professor Berkheiser taught in the Law School Clinic at the Arizona State University College of Law from 1995 to 1998 in the areas of employment, housing, and consumer law. Professor Berkheiser is the Director of the Juvenile Justice Clinic, and teaches Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure.

One year following the transplant, Simon returned to soccer competitions at UNLV. He garnered many awards at UNLV, including being named conference student athlete of the year. He was MVP of the Senior Bowl before being drafted first overall into the major indoor soccer league, just three years after his transplant.

Keith is one of the longest living organ transplant recipients in the world. His Foundation encourages organ donation, and Keith has



turned the Nevada Donor Network into the highest producing organ procurement operation in the world.

Following our group's recitation of the Rotary 4 Way Test, the meeting was adjourned at about 8:15 AM. Remember that there will be no morning meeting October 2.
