Gerry Holinski was then called upon to introduce guest speaker Mike Samuel. After serving 28 years in the Air Force,



Mike retired out of Nellis Air Force base. Mike is currently the Volunteer Coordinator for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), and he has been with the program since 2001. CASA has about 350 volunteers in Clark County.

These volunteers look out for the best interests of the over 3000 children who are in the foster care system.

After a thorough screening process, volunteers go through 36 hours of training, which enables them to review records, research information and talk to everyone involved in the foster child's care: social workers, attorneys, judges, parents, teachers, family members, and of course, the children themselves.

CASA is funded by the County, which helps to pay for the five full-time and one part-time staff. The CASA foundation is a 501C3 non-profit organization, which raises funds to support additional needs that may arise.

Mike explained that the foster system includes newborns to 18 year olds. Many of the children have special needs or handicaps that include being non-verbal, afflicted with cerebral palsy, or suffering from other medical and/or psychological issues. The ultimate goal of CASA volunteers is to help ensure that every one of these children can live in a safe, permanent home. Volunteers are asked to make a two year commitment, and the only requirement is that the volunteer has a desire to help abused and affected children.

Past President Mike thanked Mike Samuel for his informative talk and presented him with the official pen from his Rotary year. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 with recitation of the Four Way Test led by Don Havens, whose ticket was drawn for the weekly raffle.
