Moving the game to next week is appealing, probably enhancing performance, since the regular season ends in much closer proximity to December than the past when it was held in the spring. The soccer game is a volunteer intense program, and Mike is hoping that large numbers will be able to volunteer for one of the two shifts, the first beginning at 4:00 p.m. and the second at 6:30.

First Shift volunteers will be needed to collect and sell admissions, to hang banners, for concession stand stocking, and for grilling hamburgers and hotdogs.
