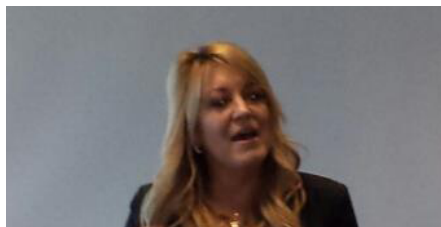

One of Rotary Club Green Valley's (RCGV) longest, most successful events is coming up at UNLV, Wednesday, December 7th, when the 24th annual high school all-star soccer game is scheduled. Charter member Jim Frey, who retired as a Dean from UNLV, was instrumental in founding the games. Jim handed off the chair position three years ago to Mike Peterson. An estimated 1,000 viewers attended last year's game, which was held in the spring, well after the close of the season. College scouts are usually present, and it is thought that the December date will draw more college reps.

Moving the game to next week is appealing, probably enhancing performance, since the regular season ends in much closer proximity to December than the past when it was held in the spring. The soccer game is a volunteer intense program, and Mike is hoping that large numbers will be able to volunteer for one of the two shifts, the first beginning at 4:00 p.m. and the second at 6:30.

First Shift volunteers will be needed to collect and sell admissions, to hang banners, for concession stand stocking, and for grilling hamburgers and hotdogs. Hats off to local Frito-Lay executive Joe Reuber, who makes product available for us to sell at the game.

During the second shift, volunteers will continue the grilling and working the concession stand. They will also sell tickets for our 50-50 fund raising raffle and they will assist in the tear down.

Mike recently e-mailed the membership that grill masters are needed as is a soccer-literate announcer to act as a spotter for Ted Gruner who does the Public Address work. \$25.00 program adds are again available. The business card ads were purchased by members
