He and his son had distributed all of the available belts when a man approached them with a need for a belt. Duane's son recognized the man's need, and volunteered his own belt to help. What a selfless act! Duane's experience proved the power of service and the community's need for clothing items, especially belts.



Gerry Holinski then introduced our guest speaker, Victoria Boyd from Philantrepreneur.com. Dr. Boyd founded Philantrepreneur.com, authored two books, Wealthy Teacher and Wow Them, and is the host of Philantrepreneur radio show. Dr. Boyd provides advice and counsel to the non-profit sector in the Valley. She shares

with them the three Ps: Profit, Passion and Purpose. Boyd helps non-profit organizations incorporate business processes to raise money, rather than relying upon the traditional "charity mode" approach. Las Vegas is home to a 48% increase in nonprofit organizations. Dr. Boyd spoke directly to the Rotary International goals. Finally, she discussed the future of Philantrepreneur.com, including a large space dedicated to housing non-profit organizations. This approach will provide low cost space, a community for sharing ideas, and assistance from Dr. Boyd and her staff.

Following Boyd's fascinating program, the raffle was held, and Jim Paxton pulled a three from the deck before he led the club reciting the Four- Way Test.

## RCGV approved for Grants to Enhance Bike Rodeo and to Provide Books to Henderson

RCGV Director and Grant Writer extraordinaire, Christine Smith has announced the Club was awarded two grants by the District 5300 Grant committee. Each year the district is given 50% of the money donated to the Rotary international Foundation three years prior by the District clubs. One grant will be used to enhance our Bike Rodeo at Robert Taylor Elementary,

and the other will be used to purchase books at Christmas for the Santa Hoolihan gift deliveries to low income children in Henderson.

The Club's Bike Rodeo has been an annual event for many years as club members assist the Taylor students with bicycle training activities. Many of the youngsters bring bicycles in disrepair, and now RCGV will be able to purchase basic parts, and perhaps hire a bike mechanic to do necessary repairs.

Santa Hoolihan has brightened Christmas for many years. With the assistance of other Club members, Hoolihan puts on his Santa Suit, loads his red armored car with toys and books, and distributes the books and presents that he acquires to hundreds of Henderson children. Last year your editor, Jim Paxton, assisted Santa Hoolihan, and Jim says it was one of the best holiday experiences he has ever had.

"Books, basketballs and Barbie Dolls were distributed to children who lined up to be with Santa Hoolihan. How thankful these youngsters and their families were for Jon's wonderful holiday event," Jim reflected. He urged club members to experience the Santa Hoolihan book and gift giving. Now Jon and the Club will be able to give even more books.
