Recent inducte Amanda Connor was then called upon to introduce guest speaker Demetri Kouretas. Demetri, CEO of The Grove NV, spoke on the timely subject of medical marijuana dispensaries in Nevada. His presentation highlighted the long, costly journey he went through to obtain the required licenses that will enable his company to cultivate, produce and dispense medical marijuana in Las Vegas. He anticipates being fully operational by the first quarter of 2016. The Grove will offer a full range of products, all produced according to strict standards for organic growing and processing, including a variety of buds, tropicals, drinks, and edibles. Members had many questions, with member Amanda Connor, Demetri's attorney, responding about licensing and legal issues.

Because the sale of marijuana is still illegal at the Federal level, physicians cannot and will not write prescriptions for the drug. Instead they can provide a recommendation to a patient, which then needs to be recognized and acknowledged by the Nevada Department of Health. Medical Marijuana cards are issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, with a purchase limit of 2.5 ounces every fourteen days. Professionals at dispensaries will advise on the doses needed to relieve specific symptoms.

Medical marijuana challenges include security and banking for what continues to be an all-cash business. Pres Duane thanked Demetri for his interesting presentation and presented him with the new speaker gift, the green pyramid paper weight.

The recitation of the Four Way Test was led by Dave Jochman, following his ticket being pulled for the raffle. Darcy Dougherty rang the bell to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 a.m.
