Madeline was the winner of the Four Way Speech contest at last Thursday's Rotary Club Green Valley (RCGV) meeting at Wildhorse Golf Club. Madeline competed against three other Green Valley and Silverado High School students relating this year's "Be a Gift to the World" theme to the "Rotary Four Way Test."

According to Speech Chairperson Russell Bowler, Madeline will advance to the regional competition against other local Southern Nevada Rotary Club winners, hoping to compete at the San Diego District Conference in June, for the \$5,000 grand prize. Madeline will be awarded a \$100 scholarship and second place finisher Sierra Ogas will receive \$50 for last week's competition. Nathaniel McConnell and Cassady Smith also delivered moving speeches. A guest spoke up, summarizing the feelings of the audience during Happy Dollars when he said, "I used to make my living as a speech instructor, and these were some of the finest speeches I have ever heard."

Last Thursday's meeting was called to order by President Duane Frizell following breakfast and social interaction between 7:00 a.m. and 7:15. Duane led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence, during which we were encouraged to honor recently diseased member Tom Bramlett. Announcements were delivered by Pres Duane.

"She is a visible and integral part of campus life who is at once a scholar, a leader, a musician, and a humanitarian. From the first day of class, Courtney's work ethic and academic talents are evident. She is a true reader who loves dystopian novels. Courtney can always be counted on to discuss the summer reading, to share her thoughts about a debate topic, and to write insightfully about what she'd read. In her more personal essays, her love and respect for her family, as well as her ambitions for the future, came through with clarity and poignancy. Courtney is well-liked by everyone in the Silverado community from teachers to students," said Ms. Roybal.

Courtney was presented a Student of the month plaque and a \$50 gift Certificate to Barnes and Nobel. She thanked her parents, her teachers, and RCGV for the Student of the Month honor. She received a standing ovation from the audience.

The day's program was the Four Way Speech contest, and Russ Bowler was recognized to act as master of ceremonies for the competition. Each speaker had an eight minute limit. The program ran late, and Pres Duane next called Trivia Master and Happy Dollars host Mike P. for an abbreviated Happy Dollars. President Elect Bob Hulshouser was happy after his President Elect Training (PETS) program, and he was also happy about the excellent speeches that he heard.
