New Rotary Board Meets to Discuss Fund Raising and Goals for Coming Year

Rotary Club Green Valley's new President Bob Hulshouser called his first meeting of the Board of Directors to order last week in the office of Jay Larson. Financial challenges are facing the Club since last year's Gala celebration has been scrapped. It was determined that it was not a good source for outside funds, because most of the approximately \$15,000 that was raised was brought forward by the members, rather than from outside sources.

Some members are investigating an Interfaith Prayer Breakfast and others are looking at sponsoring a bike race in Henderson. In addition Bob

Dworkin has agreed to review the Club's finances, which was determined as good policy last year since there was a turnover in the office of the treasurer.

Bob opened a discussion on membership growth. Debbie Mitsch, who did a great job building the Club's membership last year, will continue as Membership Chair. Currently RCGV has about 43 members, and Bob's goal is to bring that number to 50. Darcy Dougherty proposed that we have a club assembly to further determine the Club's goals.

President Bob has been widely praised for the job that he did building the high school Interact programs at Green Valley and Silverado High School. He announced that the Club will initiate a Rotaract Club at Nevada State College. Mark Roy and Gerry Holinski will be heading up that effort.

Southern Nevada is hoping to bring in high school exchange students this year. RCGV is putting out efforts toward hosting a female exchange student from Thailand. This would be the first time that RCGV has hosted an exchange student.

There was a discussion about the application process for District Awards. One board member stated that procedures for qualifying for last year's awards were not clear, and because of that, the Club did not qualify. It is hoped that in the future, guidelines will be clarified and made more consistent.
