Councilwoman March has lived in Nevada more than 40 years and in Henderson for more than 25 years. She served on the Henderson Planning Commission from 2004 - 2009. After being appointed in 2009 to represent Henderson's Ward 2 residents, she was elected to the seat in 2011 and 2015. She represents the City of Henderson on the boards of the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada and the Clark County Regional Flood Control District. March received the first lifetime achievement award from the Lied Institute of Real Estate studies in 2015; was named Nevada Public Official of the Year in 2013 by the Nevada League of Cities and Municipalities. She has also been recognized by the greater LV Association of Realtors.
