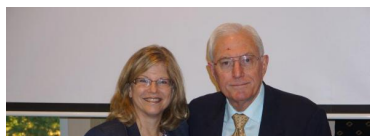

The regular Thursday meeting was called to order by RCGV President Bob Hulshouser, following a period for breakfast and fellowship at the Wildhorse Golf club. After the Pledge of Allegiance, Pres Bob read an inspirational message from Nelson Mandela before the guests were introduced by Membership Chair Debbie Mitsch. In addition to speaker David Damore, three visiting Rotarians were on hand, including Past District Governor (PDG) Tom Novatny, LV southwest, Bruce Quinn, Gallatin, TN and Paul Brenner, Sugarloaf, PA.

Past President Jim Frey opened announcements with a reminder that Shriners PGA Summerlin golf tickets are an easy opportunity for a productive fundraiser because the RCGV can keep all proceeds that we sell for this major golf event. Tickets are \$35 each, discounted from the \$40 price at the gate, and the tickets include access to the tent, where spectators have a good view of the final two holes and where food and beverages are sold.

his name, for the initial \$1,000 required to become a Paul Harris Fellow, plus another three thousand dollar donations; making him a Paul Harris Fellow plus three!

PDG Larry Skaggs delivered an informative narrative on the Wildhorse's breakfast charges, which were recently raised from \$12 to \$14 per meal. "Our meal charges are among the least expensive in the District," Larry explained. "Dues, which include the meals, will presently remain the same for us members, but visiting Rotarians will be charged \$15 in the future. Guests who express interest in joining RCGV will not be charged for their first visit, but they will be charged for repeat visits until they submit an application. The applicant will be given a complimentary breakfast, along with his or her spouse, on induction day. The student of the month and parents are not charged, and one attending school administrator is not charged as well. Speech or music contestants are also free of charge, and teachers receiving mini-grants are our guests for breakfast. Our exchange student is our complimented guest.

Jasmine traveled to California last weekend on a surfing trip. Delinda said that Jasmine is having a little difficulty with U.S. History, but she is doing well in her Coronado High School classes. Jim Paxton, who taught history for four years, has volunteered to tutor Jasmine.

Past President and Trivia Master Mike Peterson told us that "Today is Adopt-a-Dog-Day, so the day's trivia would be on famous dogs. Susan Johnson had a happy dollar for the return of Jon Hoolihan, and she was happy that the wine club has their wine in the barrel. Greg Bruce was happy that another improv show was scheduled the following Saturday.

Two Illinois immigrants, Darcy Dougherty and Dave Jochman, sang songs honoring the Chicago Cubs for advancing to the world series. Dave had a happy weekend with other wins by the Illinois University and by the Rebels. Jim Frey introduced the days speaker, UNLV Political Science Professor Dr. David Damore. Damore has been called the "Voice of Nevada Politics." He had attended the presidential debate at UNLV the night before, along with 5000 journalists from all over the world.



Damore analyzed the election, saying that Hillary is on track to be the first democrat to win among college educated women.

He also reported that Utah and Arizona, typically in the Republican column, are likely to go for Hillary. Two years ago the strength of the Tea Party swept a comfortable majority into the House of Representatives. Damore thinks that the Republicans will maintain their House majority, but they may lose a few house seats. "The Democrats may well win back control of the Senate," he predicted.

"Nevada is a swing state," Damore explained. "It has voted for the presidential winner every time but once, in the last 100 years. More of our residents were

born in California than were born in Nevada, and foreigners make up a big percentage of our population. Many of our residents speak English as a second language. The language diversity and the fact that we are a 24 hour economy, make Nevada a difficult place to accurately survey," he explained.

"The Republicans will lose some of their seats in the House, but they should retain control there, depending upon how well that Hillary can turn-out the vote. Turn-out will determine congressional results as well as which party controls the Nevada Legislature."

Dr. Damore explained why that television is so full of advertising for the Senate Race. Twenty one million was raised by Carol Masto and \$17 million by Joe Heck. "Heck is a strong candidate who was swept into office by the strength of the Tea Party two years ago. Normally Republicans do better in the north, but Masco attended the University of Nevada Reno, so she has real strength in Northern Nevada," Damore said.

Dr. Damore touched on the four ballot measures, including the proposed increase in background checks at gun shows, the proposed legalization of recreational marijuana, the deregulating of the energy monopoly, and the forth measure, which would increase the fuel tax and thereby pay for better roads.

Following Dr. Damore's program, our weekly drawing was held, and Greg Bruce's ticket was drawn. Greg did the right thing, leaving the jokers in the deck for another week. Janet Pancoast led the Club reciting the four Way Test, before President Bob dismissed the meeting at 8:15.
