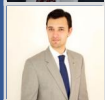

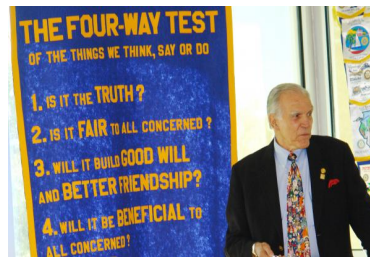

Rotarian and District Foundation Chair **Mary Ann Avnet**, from the Las Vegas Club, was called to introduce the speaker. Mary Ann had kind words about RCGV's excitement and enthusiasm. **Dr. Capozzi** is a "long time Rotaplast Veteran, and was one of its founders. This spring will be his third trip to Lima, Peru, and he has logged trips to India, Bangladesh, and Guatemala. Dr. Capozzi led the first Rotaplast trip 25 years ago to Chile. The trip had been intended to be a one-time project. The program has been so successful that Rotary, the non- medical volunteers, and the doctors have repeated the project in each of the past 25 years.

"The Chilean Club was an affluent one. They paid for our transportation and housed us in their homes. We attempt to work closely with a sponsoring

Rotary Club, which is responsible for publicizing the project, drawing patients, and assisting us with the local medical facility. Usually local plastic surgeons and doctors will join the 6-8 day project," Angelo explained.

Dr. Capozzi explained that cleft palate is partly genetic, but not totally. Causes of the deformity are being researched. He had many before-and-after photographs of the patients. When Rotaplast started 25 years ago, the average cost was \$250 per patient. Today's cost is \$950. Rotaplast has treated more than 19,000 children, on 219 missions, in 26 countries." What a special mission to serve humanity!

Following Angelo's program, the raffle was held and a charmed **Mark Roy** pulled his second joker in the past month. President Bob dismissed the lengthy meeting.
