"We are hoping to have 20 volunteers, including College of Southern Nevada Rotaract members," Duane explained. Two shifts are scheduled, 8:00- 11:00 a.m., and the second shift is from 11:00 - 2:00 p.m. More volunteers are needed for the morning shift since the children will be riding bicycles through skill- building activities. Dwayne and several other Club members attended a training workshop, and the School District will be providing bicycles for the activities. The Club will again be providing safety helmets for some of the children, and the State Department of Education has other gift items for the youngsters including coloring books, reflectors and bracelets. Club Director Christine Smith secured a District Funding Grant, which will provide \$2,000 to purchase bicycles for some of the more disadvantaged children. "At -a-way Chris!"
