Many times, we do not recognize what the source of conflict is, thereby frustrating our efforts to manage the problem and to resolve the conflict. There are techniques to properly identify conflict. These include: active listening, paraphrasing, and perception checking. By implementing these techniques, we can better manage and resolve conflicts. We all appreciated Terry's dynamic presentation and came away better informed of this relevant issue and on how to better resolve our conflicts.
