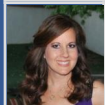

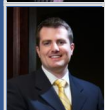

It was fascinating to hear her experiences with the people and the culture of India.

Janet was struck by the chaos of traffic in New Delhi, and the strict security measures for her and her colleagues. The local Rotary clubs allowed the foreign service volunteers to accommodate local norms while providing the much needed vaccines. For example, women and children were drawn to the streets where the workers and vaccines were being distributed by a parade of drummers. The noise and excitement served to attract the attention of persons that would not otherwise be outside and facilitated the expeditious inoculation of the area.

Janet expressed that her time in India was a reminder that the luxuries we surround ourselves with may not be as important as we think. She also learned about the history of the area and got a first-hand look at the relationship between groups that had occupied the area for thousands of years. In addition to giving inoculations, Janet also participated in building a dam, a physical test that her office job had not prepared her for. We are proud of the work Janet did in India and for her contributions to the Club. Janet's service to India is a reminder that Rotary is an organization doing good worldwide.

At the end of the meeting, **Greg Bruce** won the raffle and walked away with \$6. **Julie Todd** lead the club in reciting the 4-way test.
