Rotary Debunking Recap

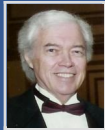

Bob proudly touted the hosting of this year's High School Exchange Student, Jasmine Sinthuwatin, who lived with Delinda Crampton's family during the school year. Other youth accomplishments for RCGV included participation in youth leadership camps: RYLA and TLC. RCGV continued its monthly Student of the Month Awards for Green Valley and Silverado High Schools. Eighteen teacher mini grants ranging from \$130 to \$250 were awarded to Henderson teachers for the purpose of expanding classroom learning. RCGV recently completed the Bike Rodeo, during which Club members taught safety and riding fundamentals. RCGV gave away 28 bicycles to financially challenged students at Robert Taylor Elementary. Additionally, the Club promoted excellence in speaking with the Four Way Speech contest and in Music with the Dan Stover Competition.

Club members again assisted with the Opportunity Village Christmas Fair and the Club resumed the Souper Bowl of Caring Food Drive. For the 25th year, Jon H. dressed up as Santa and delivered hundreds of gifts to children in financially disadvantaged neighborhoods. Books were also distributed to the children thanks to a District Grant secured by Christine Smith.

Next, the outgoing board was introduced, and each director received a gift package containing binoculars from outgoing President Bob. Bob awarded the Spark Plug Award to Jon Hoolihan for his longtime service.



A **Lifetime of Service Award** went to Past President Mike Pederson, who coordinates the All Star High School Soccer Game, played at UNLV. Each week he has provided entertainment and often befuddlement with his trivia, followed by Happy and Dammit Dollars. Mike said that he was surprised to be given an award after he has taken his fellow members' money each week!

Another RCGV Success: Polio Plus. Not only did the Club meet its donation goals, but according to PDG Larry S., there have only been six new cases of polio worldwide, this year through last week! We are on the doorstep of eradication!

Next, the new Board of Directors for 2017-18 was introduced. Then Outgoing President Bob H. presented a President's Pin and the Club Charter to incoming President Brad Marx.. Brad's wife, Kara was introduced and presented with a flower bouquet.
