Dave Jochman introduced the day's speaker, **Ed Hall**, of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association. When Ed joined the Association there were 61 members in the Las Vegas area. He is now one of two remaining locally. Ed joined the U.S. Army at age 16 and was assigned to a transport ship that sailed from the East Coast through the Panama Canal to its bucolic assignment at Fort Armstrong at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii.

In the early morning hours of December 7, 1941, now age 18, Ed was preparing to spray paint a barracks mess hall at Hickham Field. He heard a boom, another and then a horrible explosion in hangers 9 and 11. Chunks of asphalt were kicking up around him when he saw a Zero flying toward him firing its guns. The Japanese plane came close enough that he could see the pilot smiling. Fourteen men in the barracks lost their lives in the attack and the mess hall that he was preparing to paint was destroyed. Ed was a first hand observer of wounded with terrible injuries and misery. In all, over 2600 servicemen were killed that day; 1,171 of them on the battleship U.S.S. Arizona, now a monument and still a commissioned Navy ship.

It was our considerable privilege to hear Ed Hall at last week's meeting. This well spoken, still sharp nonagenarian was and is a living treasure.
