Programs

Field of Honor Kick-Off

PDG and Chair Larry shared that a lot of behind the scenes work has been going on for the Field of Honor and now it is time for the entire club to be involved! Now we begin selling flags and soliciting sponsorships. PR Chai**Julie Todd** explained the contents of the envelopes that were distributed, filled with flag sales and sponsorship forms. She noted that all checks should be made payable to the*Nevada Rotary Foundation* and that online credit card purchases can be made through links on both the Rotary Club of Green Valley (NV) Facebook page or on our website greenvalleyrotary.or greenvalleyrotary.orgCo-Chair **Mark Roy** reviewed sponsorship solicitation and asked that anyone with a potential big donor, please contact him for support. Mayor Debra March

Gerry Holinski introduced Henderson Mayor and former Rotary Club of Green Valley member, the Honorable Debra March. She indicated that both of her parents and her son were military, so the Field of Honor holds a special place in her heart. She pledged a \$1,000 sponsorship!

Mayor March shared some interesting information about the city of Henderson including the growth to 105 square miles and 309,000 residents. The Henderson Executive Airport area will be Henderson's commercial nexus, especially with the addition of the Raider's practice field and corporate offices. They will bring many jobs and additional new residents.

She proclaimed education quality as a top priority. A Community Education Advisory Board has been created. The graduation rate in Henderson is 81%, well above the local and state rates but with room for improvement. Thirty percent of marijuana sales proceeds will go to education.

Mayor March welcomed questions from the club members. Topics included alternative transportation as the city grows. She indicated that a culture of transit is encouraged and there is an effort to teach high school students about the benefits of public transportation use. She indicated that the Water Street downtown development continues with several multi-use complexes and residential projects slated. The College of Southern Nevada (CSN) has two buildings downtown where classes are offered. The CSN campus, through private/public partnerships, is making improvements including a new student union. The city continues to work with them to bring businesses to them. The convention center is future is being discussed. Decisions on the scope of the work will be made based on the competition with other venues. It is important for community activities but with a commercial use, too.



Asked about the overall goals of her administration, the Mayor shared that her list of goals for her first 100 days was achieved. In the future, she would like to see more opportunities for women in the city. Only 2% of city contracts are with companies owned by women. She would also like to see the State Legislature work more closely with cities.

Adjournment

The raffle pot was over \$2,000. **Julie Todd** drew a "5" winning \$5.00. Julie then led the club in The 4 Way Test. The meeting adjourned at 8:12 am.
