**Ajay Kumar Agrawal**, Rotarian Team Leader, works in petroleum transporting and operating a chain of petroleum outlets. He is currently Assistant Governor in District 3261. **Awleen Chawla**, 23, has a degree in economics and works in sales and marketing. She enjoys designing jewelry and travel, and spends her leisure playing badminton, board games and watching TV.

**Montek Singh Hura**, 28, works in his family business (retail and hospitality). India is a 4,500-year-old culture and home to 1.4 billion people in 29 states and seven territories, has nine different religions, over 100 traditional dances, and 2000 mother tongues. It is a culture of "Unity in Diversity."

District 3261 has 2,430 members with 218 of them being female. A major project is the heart-shaped Satya Sai Hospital for Children. The district also conducts RAHAT Camp (Rotary Active Hands Are Touching) for 13 days, 25 doctors, 200 nursing staff, and 359 volunteers to care for thousands in need of medical treatment. Cyclothon is a fundraising cycling rally and over 200 bicycles were distributed to the needy.
