Program

Judy Stokey - NV Energy

Judy Stokey from NV Energy spoke on their opposition of Question 3 the Energy Choice Initiative. Question 3 would open Nevada's energy market to competition and passed with 72 percent support in 2016. Because the measure amends the state constitution, it must again receive voter approval in 2018 before it becomes law. Judy stated that the law is worded very vaguely and their studies show that implementation will be extremely costly to the state and tax payers. The Professional Firefighters of Nevada, Nevada Association of Public Safety Officers and AARP Nevada all oppose Question 3 stating that its passage would increase electricity rates, create a less reliable electricity system, and make senior citizens vulnerable to fraud.
