

Program

Jim Gibson - County Commissioner

Jim started his presentation by saying that he loves the valley and what we have accomplished over the years. Things are humming here. He had a few subjects he wanted to talk about: challenges in his district, land boundaries, and the issue of homelessness. His district goes from Tropicana to Boulder City. Challenges in this district include expansion of the disposal boundary. He would like to expand the airport, because its current space limits the amount of flights we can get. He would like more federal land so he can expand the freeway in some way. We are getting close to not having enough room. He also doesn't want the City of Henderson to be land locked. He feels that challenges that come with growth are better than challenges that come with stagnation. He feels the homelessness here is overwhelming. Flood channels and freeway underpasses house homeless people. How on earth do we address the human side? Only 2 out of 10 are willing to accept assistance. Those with a mental illness are among that population. Metro police are now doing community enforcement with the homeless population. He feels that we need to overcome bias in that community. He then talked about how being a Mayor is very different from his current job as a County Commissioner. He is challenged on every level. He would like the County to get more efficient with building permits to speed up the process. He would like the County fully employed so that they can assess and then work on changes so contractors can get their projects done guiker. He said the biggest difference between being the Mayor and being a County Commissioner is that he is one of 7 now. He ended his presentation by discussing his love of community service, and how serving the community is a blessing.
