Don Havins announced our speaker by presenting everyone with uncirculated coins of President John Tyler. John Tyler stepped into the role after President Willam Harrison died. He was an innovator and entrepreneur, much like his Great Grandson, our speaker, Doug Geinzer.

Doug started his presentation by letting everyone know that he is not a healthcare guy by trade, but it has become his passion. He saw a need for better healthcare in Southern Neveda after dealing with his own health challenges. He made a promise that no one would have to leave the state for good comprehensive healthcare. He started Las Vegas HEALS to meet the challenges that we have in our community. Our health outcomes are lower than average, and his passion is to improve access to better healthcare for everyone. Las Vegas HEALS is a coalition of healthcare professionals and administrators working together to make those improvements.

Las Vegas HEALS is currently working to ensure that our medical schools have the support that they need, that we keep our students here in Southern Nevada after their residencies, and that our doctors get better reimbursement rates from the insurance companies. They work within the state legislature to ensure our doctors are taken care of financially so that they can help more people medically. He believes that we really need to start asking questions and supporting our doctors as a community if we want better health outcomes. They are also working on medical tourism, wellness tourism and retreats, medical meetings and education opportunities, and sports medicine and research. Las Vegas HEALS wants to put Las Vegas Valley at the forefront of travel tourism for healthcare education and conferences.
