She has worked in a variety of positions with the library district since 2003, and is passionate about literacy and advocating for libraries in our community. She holds a BA in Communication Studies from UNLV and a MS in Library Sciences from Texas Women's University. She was born and raised in Henderson where she continues to enjoy living with her husband and daughter.



Ms. Smedley shared that the Henderson Libraries were founded in 1944 and are primarily funded by property taxes. There is a Board of Trustees made up of seven volunteers, including our own PP Jim Frey. Still recovering after the economic downturn ten years ago, the current library budget is \$8.6 million. Ms. Smedley has been working with the Board on surveys and a strategic plan that will be

implemented in January, using their findings to chart the way for the future. There was found to be a real need for school-age children services.
