PP Bob Hulshouser introduced our guest, Dan Atkins, VFW Commander of Post 3848 in Henderson. Through our Field of Honor, PP Hulshouser and Jim Allanson have developed new bonds with veterans in the community. That is how PP Bob met Dan Atkins and brought him to speak in honor of Veteran's Day, 2018.



Dan brought with him Richard's Bell which was installed on the U.S.S. Dunlap during World War II. A sailor from that ship obtained the bell after she was decommissioned and donated it to the VFW Post 3848.

Post 3848 is 81 years old and owns its own building at 401 W. Lake Mead Blvd. Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States IVFW) is a patriotic veterans and service organization that meets in

comradeship for the benefit of veteran's causes and for service to the community. There are three requirements to be a VFW member: citizen, honorably discharged and served on foreign soil.

Dan wants to help the future by giving back. He worries about the Iraqi veterans. The group is distributing poppies every Veteran's and Memorial Day to benefit the National Home for Children which supports families of fallen soldiers. 3848 is a busy post and has many projects throughout the year.
