Jon Ponder, CEO of Hope for Prisoners

Guest **Angela Brookins** introduced our guest speaker, **Jon Ponder**, Founder and CEO of HOPE for Prisoners. Mr. Ponder started HOPE for Prisoners in 2009 after he was released from prison. He started the organization because he wanted to give back to the community and take all that he learned through his own personal journey through the prison system and help others. The organization works with prisoners through a pre-vocational leadership program. They give people tools, help create new and healthier reference points for living, and work to unify the family after serving time. Through training and mentorship, the goal is to create stand-up leaders in the community and stop recidivism. They have 350 local mentors that go through certification to support and encourage program attendees. They are funded through private donations and grants, and the program they provide is spreading across the country. Jon Ponder was incredibly inspiring and touched many members with his personal stories and passion for making the world a better place.
