Jim Allanson introduced our speakers from UNLV Rebel Vets. They gave an informative presentation on all that they do for veterans at UNLV. They have 1800 students on the G.I. Bill that are studying at UNLV. They make sure that all of their students, and their families, have all of the resources and assistance that they need to get through a school year. They were proud to announce that on average, 68% of their students graduate, and their graduates have gone on to become doctors, lawyers, and elected officials. Ross Bryant has, in his tenure, worked to change legislation to help military students get the money they deserve for a college education. The center boasts priority registration, peer-to-peer mentoring, and many other services to assist their students. The UNLV Rebel Vets Organization teamed up with Truckee Meadows Community College to execute the first statewide Operation Battle Born Ruck March in honor of the fallen heroes from the Global War on Terrorism. Over the course of 8 days, veterans and volunteers marched 370 miles while taking turns carrying two rucksacks held a combined total of 7,000 service member dog tags, including the 57 fallen Nevadans. They were a very inspiring group, and we were all moved by their service to other veterans in our community.
