speaker, LJ Edmondson. Mastering Mindsets serves children aged 5-17 in Las Vegas valley. LJ Edmondson is a SOAR award winner for being a safety officer, recently won the Trailblazer Award, and was officer of the year in 2016. He is also a veteran, single father, and Person of Action.

LJ Edmondson started Mastering Mindsets, a youth empowerment organization, with friends interested in helping to further educate their own children. The idea started in a barbershop, and has grown from being free workshops with their own kids into serving over 200 youth. They currently have 65 registered active children in their program. LJ and his friends were tired of having opinions on what needed to be changed and started the work to change things themselves. Mastering Mindsets looks to help children acquire new skills, it exposes them to new ideas, teaches nutrition, and teaches how everything in our lives are linked. The organization deals with low-income areas and youth, and helps the youth in their programs gain cultural esteem through empowering education.
