USAF Museum Director Mr. Tillotson

The National Museum of the United States Air Force collects, researches, conserves, interprets and presents the Air Force's history, heritage and traditions, as well as today's mission to fly, fight and win ... in Air, Space and Cyberspace to a global audience through engaging exhibits, educational outreach, special programs, and the stewardship of the national historic collection. These statutory duties delegated by the Secretary of the Air Force are accomplished on behalf of the American people. We are the keepers of their stories.

Former Assistant Deputy Chief Management Officer for the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Mr. David Tillotson III, was recently appointed as the director of the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force. At the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force, Tillotson will manage nearly one million square feet of exhibit space with more than 350 aerospace vehicles and missiles, and thousands of other artifacts.

He will also provide technical and professional guidance to the U.S. Air Force Heritage Program, which includes more than 2,400 aerospace vehicles and over 46,000 other artifacts, on loan to nearly 780 domestic and international military heritage activities, civilian museums, cities, municipalities, and veterans' organizations.

PROGRAM

Cheri Hottinger introduced John Rosen from Cherry Valley Hotel. **Cheri** then shared a few facts about Jon including: he is a native of San Fransisco, actively involved in Granville, has two boys of the ages 16 and 11, and a wife, Brooklyn. **Cheri** thanked him for delivering on promises and sharing this property.

John thanked us for being on property and shared some information before sending us out on tours of the rooms, lobby, exhibit hall (old water park) and restaurant.

Widewaters is a Syracuse based real estate development, company that now operates the hotel.

Provided history on the Cherry Valley Hotel included: constructed by State Farm in 1992; expanded in 2000 from 120 rooms to 200; Denver based private equity company added the 50,000 gallon water park in 2004; a Houston based owner and operator took over in 2012 and was listed for sale in August 2016; Acquired by Wexford and Widewaters November of 2017; planning and MEP repairs began in 2018 and construction in 2019.

Helpful strategy within the new and improved hotel is the 50/50 partnership with Newark and a bed tax that acquires ½ to pay for the exhibition center construction. After all is finalized, there will be 200 renovated guestrooms.

Ohio Event Center will include The O and E Tap house which will open in late November. This theme honors the O and E Canal that was in this location!

Phase 3 of this renovation will include a Spa in March of 2020. There are still a few things to complete which include fire pits, the final signage, string lighting and the library courtyard.

Questions

- Why Hotel vs Lodge in name? A minor change. Wanted to keep Cherry Valley so hotel worked for the new and improved location. Full name includes Ohio Event!
- Consider connection to branded hotel? Not in the plan, 65% group will help us.
