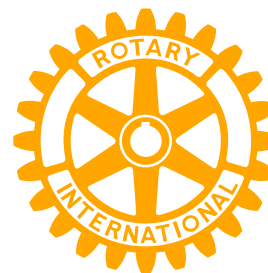

Cheri Hottinger introduced Jenny Morehead, who rode 600 miles for Pelotonia, and Jenny introduced Karl Koon, Directory of Recruitment – Team Buckeye, Pelotonia. Karl has participated in every Pelotonia since 2009, one of less than 250 individuals who can make that claim.

Karl Koon began his talk with a quote from Albert Pine — 'What we do for ourselves dies with us. What we do for others and the world remains and is immortal.'

He explained a bit about his background; he is a native of NW Ohio who graduated from OSU in 1979 with a bachelor's degree in communications. During his senior year, he made lifelong friends through the cheerleading squad which also helped shape some of his career opportunities. Connections from cheerleading led him to his present job as a Development Officer for The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center – James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute and the Director of Rider Recruitment for Team Buckeye, the official super-peloton (team).

Team Buckeye is comprised of students, faculty, staff, alumni and constituent groups of The Ohio State University participating in Pelotonia, an annual bike tour developed to raise funds for cancer research at The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center. Created in 2008, Pelotonia is a three-day experience that includes a weekend of cycling, entertainment and volunteerism. This year, the Pelotonia ride will take place August 2-4, and registration opens Feb. 21. The \$100 registration fee helps defray costs such as food, drinks, and logistics along the course, and then participants make a commitment to raise funds based on the distance they will ride; there are opportunities for folks to ride from 25 miles to 200 miles. Last year, there were 8,400 riders from 14 states which raised \$27.4 million. Two areas of support are to pay for undergraduate and graduate research fellowships, and for Idea grants to attract the best researchers to OSU. To date, Pelotonia has raised more than \$184M, and 100 percent of every rider-raised dollar to cancer research at Ohio State.

Karl's responsibilities include helping assure that anybody who wants to participate in the event will be successful, whether as a volunteer, a rider, or a "virtual" rider. One way is through corporate sponsors, and the new "PULL" app is an activity tracker that also provides credit for riders based on how active they are, which helps boost their fundraising. Karl stated that it takes over 3,000 volunteers to orchestrate the event, and that OSU/N is the most successful of the five OSU satellite campuses. He ended his presentation with this Marianne Williamson quote, "Success means we go to sleep at night knowing that our talents and abilities were used in a way that served others."
