Mike Massaro introduced Russ Nelson, Newark Catholic Robotics Advisor.

Mr. Nelson introduced Kevin Benis, a Senior at Newark Catholic High School and a founding member of the Robotics Club, known as Brain Wave. The Club was founded in 2016 to give students the opportunity pursue real world experiences in manufacturing and to have scholarship opportunities. It was decided to follow FIRST Structure. There are more than 7,000 teams active worldwide.

There are several different levels to FIRST. The first level is for elementary and middle school students. The highest level is open to high school students. The Club operates with a budget of about \$18,000.00 per year and they compete with Clubs that have much higher budgets. He also stated that the club is looking for ways to increase community activities and a primary sponsor.

Kevin described the design changes from year to year, improving efficiency with the design with each year experience.

The build season is 6 weeks and the rules change each year. They break into small groups and analyze problems. Then they create a prototype. Last year the team placed 19th at the Regional Event and went on to place 9th at State. This year unfortunately, they placed 20th with a 5-4 record.

Kevin plans to attend the University of Dayton to study Mechanical Engineering and Physics. He then introduced the rest of the team: Abbey Salome, Garrett McCarty and Kaley Barnett. They then gave a presentation of the robot. All competitions are 2 minutes 30 seconds.
