### THIS WEEK'S MEETING

Reinventing Prosthetics, Form5 Prosthetics Inc. – Aaron Westbrook OSU Student

As someone who has lived much of his life with only one hand Aaron Westbrook knows how to help the recipients of his nonprofit, Form5 Prosthetics Inc. He learned from personal experience what people go through to receive a prosthetic limb, prompting him to research more cost-effective ways to make them.

"When I went through the standard process of getting a prosthesis I realized how outdated it was," he said. "I wanted to integrate today's technology to make environmentally friendly, 3-D prosthetics from recycled materials."

With the advent of 3-D printing technology, Form5 Prosthetics Inc. can provide what once was considered a luxury item for those with limb differences. Prosthetics that were too expensive for most people to afford can now be custom-made for significantly less money and in much less time.

**Janice LoRaso** introduced **Roe Mauro**, District RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) Co-Chair who has been a Rotary member since 2000. She sees over all youth service programs in our district (6690). When she was asked to take on the RYLA responsibility, Rotarian **Larry Jenkins** and her visited other districts to figure out what RYLA was and how to make it happen in 6690. The first 6690 conference for RYLA was held in 2011.

Information about RYLA:

- Over 59 clubs in district 6690 and over 40 clubs send students to RYLA
  - Some clubs send 1 to 2 students others send 6 to 8 students.
- Guidelines and criteria are given to clubs to decide which students to send to RYLA.
- The conference is typically held at OU. This year, 87 students participated.
- Opening day they had 87 students this year.
- Sleep in the dorms and eat the cafeteria food

At the RYLA conference, students participate in many different activities that inspire them with cooperation and build communication skills. The students focus on team building, working together, listening, and getting projects done. They are separated into smaller groups of 20 to 24 students per group, and they work with volunteer facilitators. These groups are to help the students self identify what type of leader they perceive themselves to be.

One of the main purposes for RYLA is to educate students about Rotary, including the core values and the four way test. Students are also given an opportunity to bring back an activity called "Purple Pinkies for Polio" to their schools where they raise money, and RYLA will match what the students raise to be donated to Polio research.

Two students who went through the Free Enterprise program gave testimonials about their experiences at RYLA this year. Ben from Newark High School mentioned how he learned about leadership and the most important thing he learned was that as a leader, you don't always have to be the person who does all of the work, but you're the person who makes sure the works gets done while involving everyone. Lucas from Utica High School mentioned that his favorite part was having two public speakers talk to the group about public speaking. He said they were funny, quick and super confident.

Roe mentioned that RYLA has become very diverse throughout the years and is trying to encourage clubs to provide alternate students in case a few of the students who originally signed up aren't able to attend due to sports, work or vacations.
