I surrounded myself with people of like thought, of course they were Rotarians, and my journey started to define itself. Today, it is my honor and


privilege to be District Governor for Rotary District 6690 and to work with all of you to make a difference.






Tanya Hitchens, past president of the Byesville Rotary, was recognized for earning a Paul Harris Fellowship, and presented with a Paul Harris medallion.

New Albany: Inauguration of new officers



Rotary Night with the Ohio Machine

Worthington AM hosted the first annual District Rotary Night with the Ohio Machine on Saturday evening in Delaware. Although the weather didn't cooperate and the game was delayed for a while, it was a very entertaining overtime victory for the Machine.

The Ohio Machine wore new, all-black uniforms against the Denver Outlaws on Rotary Night on Saturday, July 26. Clad in all black, the Machine stormed back to force overtime before Kyle Harrison netted the game-winning goal just minutes into the extra frame. This game marked the first time in club history the Machine hasn't worn Blue or White jerseys and will be the only time the Machine will sport the all-black jerseys this season.

Following the game, each Machine player signed his game-worn jersey and all 19 player jerseys, and a team-signed jersey, are up for auction online. All proceeds from the auction will benefit Rotary International's quest to end Polio. Together, the Machine and Rotary International will help to 'blackout polio.'

The Black Out Polio jerseys looked great for the national television audience, and now the on-line auction has started for the game-worn and autographed jerseys. The online auction will run for 7 days beginning on Monday, July 28 at 3 p.m. EST and ending on August 4 at 3 p.m. EST.

Rotary International has been committed to ending polio since 1979. Since then, Rotary International and its partners have reduced the cases of polio by 99 percent worldwide. Through donation and funds raised, Rotary International has helped immunize more the 2 billion children against polio in 122 countries.
