
Gahanna:

Club Activities

Westerville Sunrise:

The Westerville Sunrise Rotary Club organized its 19th Annual Chilly Open fundraising event on Saturday, February 7, 2015 at the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium. This family-oriented event brought in nearly 3,000 attendees and featured food from 23 area restaurants with three new restaurants stepping up to join the event. A crowd favorite, Papa John's, gave out around 200 pizzas and Skyline gave nearly 2,000 chili dogs all while The Debits kept the crowd energized with live music.

There was a wonderful silent auction with many great items to bid on. This year's live auctions were able to bring in nearly \$13,000 thanks to the help from Frankie Hejduk of the Columbus Crew. The crowd was also entertained by local celebrities Dom Tiberi of WBNS 10TV and Woody Johnson of WCOL 92.3. The number of families attending this event continues to rise thanks to the Children's Open always being a huge hit with supervised entertainment in the Activity Pavilion of the Zoo

The event had wonderful media coverage again this year with donated cost at nearly \$300,000! There were 116 video clips shown on WBNS 10TV, over 280 live promotion announcements made on WCOL 92.3 during their community breaks and in e-blasts and website ads. ClearChannel Outdoor provided over 840,000 digital ads and helped develop a consistent image to use throughout promotions. Columbus Monthly, Columbus ALIVE!, and Columbus Parent all ran ads for the event. The Westerville Magazine ran a 2-page spread about the history of The Chilly Open. The Columbus Zoo and Aquarium ran an ad in the Beastly Banner Publication which reaches 65,000 homes, an ad in the Beastly Bytes which goes out to 45,000 email addresses, and had an ad on their website which averages 150,000 monthly visits.

Over the course of 19 years, the Chilly Open has raised over \$2.4 million. The Westerville Sunrise Rotary Club organizes this event, so all proceeds go to area children's charities such as The Children's Hunger Alliance, The Ohio Trooper's Caring Fund, The Maria Tiberi Foundation, Mount Carmel St. Ann's, W.A.R.M., The Buckeye Ranch, St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, and the Ubumwe Community Center in Rwanda, Africa. Together, we have made a positive impact on the lives of many children in our area.

Newark Rotary Poised to Celebrate 100 Years with Playground Expansion Legacy Project

In preparation for its 100th anniversary in December 2016, the Newark Rotary Club will expand Rotary Park in Newark, including improvements to the popular Rotary Accessible Playground built in 2005.

The goal of the improvements is accommodating more groups, expanding parking and creating a new, safer entrance. Newark Rotary members unanimously voted to proceed with the estimated \$500,000 investment. The existing pavilion, built in 1998, is frequently too busy with scheduled groups arriving to find others already using the facility. A new smaller pavilion (first-come, first-served) is proposed along with six picnic pods with seating for up to 12 people each.


