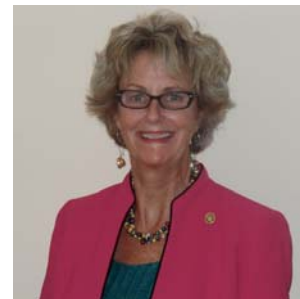
District Governor Makes Official Visit

Newly-installed Governor of Rotary District 7600, Susan Zachensky-Walthall (Susan Z-W) is familiar to many members of HT Rotary, as she installed our new board in June. Susan and her husband, Zach, make a return visit this week, but it's in her official capacity as Governor this time.

A native of Alberta, VA, and graduate of Old Dominion University, DG Susan has worked for over 35 years as an instructor and women's basketball coach at the college level in California and Virginia. A charter member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association, she has held many NCAA Women's Basketball committee positions.

Susan started in Rotary in California, serving as District Sergeant-at-Arms and Commemorative Program chair. She has been a member of the Lawrenceville club for 13 years and, in 2007 was selected as Rotarian of the Year. She was presented the Governor's Award for Outstanding Club President in 2009-10 and has had perfect attendance for 18 years. For D7600, she has served as an Area Governor, Rotaract chair, Conference co-chair and chair. She is a Rotary Leadership Institute graduate and a Paul Harris Fellow 3+. She has been a speaker at Zone 33 and district conferences from Maryland to South Carolina, sharing her Rotary story, including the reason she wears her signature tennis shoes.
