WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: "It is celebrated annually in March. It started as Women's Day, which was celebrated on February 28, 1909, by a group of Manhattan socialists and suffragists in honor of the one-year anniversary of the garment strike led by the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union."

"In the United States, Women's History Month has been observed since 1987. It is a dedicated month to reflect on the often-overlooked contributions of women to U.S. history. From Abigail Adams to Susan B. Anthony, Sojourner Truth to Rosa Parks, the timeline of women's history milestones stretches back to the founding of the United States."

"This year, Women's History Month will take place from Friday, March 1 to Sunday, March 31, 2024. The theme for 2024 celebrates "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion," recognizing women who understand the need to eliminate bias and discrimination from individuals' lives and institutions."

Founded in 1905 by Paul Harris, Rotary International began as a fellowship of professionals committed to service above self. Its spirit transcended gender, and as Rotary expanded globally, women found their place within its ranks.

Trailblazers in Rotary: Women Who Made History

 Sylvia Whitlock: The First Female Rotary Club President

In 1987, Sylvia Whitlock etched her name in history as the first female Rotary Club president. Leading the Rotary Club of Duarte, California, she shattered barriers. Her presidency symbolized more than a title; it was a beacon for women worldwide. Whitlock's commitment to community service resonated with Rotary's core values.

Jennifer Jones: The First Female President of Rotary International

In 2022, Jennifer Jones made history as the first female president of Rotary International. In leading Rotary International, she understood the importance of communicating the new realities of the 21st century. She championed the importance of diversity, equity, and inclusion and the need for diversity to be reflected in leadership.

3. The Rotary Foundation: Empowering Women Globally

The Rotary Foundation became a catalyst for change. Its programs uplifted women across continents:

- Rotary Peace Fellowships: Empowering women to resolve conflicts and promote peace.
- Scholarships: Enabling women to pursue higher education.
- Polio Eradication: Women played pivotal roles in vaccinating children against polio.

Challenges and Triumphs

Women faced hurdles within Rotary. The 1989 Council on Legislation officially admitted women as members and opened the doors for women to serve in all capacities in Rotary worldwide. It was a watershed moment—a testament to their persistence.

Today and Tomorrow

Women continue to lead Rotary clubs, districts, and global initiatives. They amplify Rotary's impact, from clean water projects to literacy campaigns. Their legacy exemplifies the Rotary International motto: "Service
