Eligibility: High School Seniors graduating from Central Kitsap High School, Klahowya Secondary School, Crosspoint Academy, or Home Schooled students (who would otherwise attend a school listed), who plan to attend a four-year college or university, two-year community college or technical/vocational school in the Fall of 2025 may apply.

Minimum GPA of 3.0 for applications for a four-year college or university. Otherwise, must meet the entrance requirements for the school of choice. Please consider applying for an Education Assistance grant if you do not meet these requirements.

The scholarships are designated for graduating high school students who played in band (wind instruments or percussion) in high school, and who are planning to continue playing in their post-high school lives. Majoring in music in college is not mandatory. The Hometown Band would like to send a representative to attend the high school scholarship award ceremony for the high schools where recipients are honored. Recipients will be asked to attend several Tuesday evening rehearsals with The Hometown Band with the hopes of having the students perform for at least one of the band's spring concerts.

Scholarship on behalf of Robert Arper, a STEM focused scholarship
