Cynthia Chirot's Year as President: 1990-91

The festival banners were inaugurated in July at the annual ID Street Fair. The two colorful street banners now span the streets across Maynard at South Jackson and across S King at Maynard all summer long. The banner design was selected in an open competition and funds for production were provided by Roary, ID merchants and the City of Seattle Matching Fund.

The Special Projects Committee, headed by Hwa Tsun Feng, selected the At Risk Asian Youth Program as the major new long term project. The club has provided approximately \$12,000 in funds to the CISC to help first generation Asian immigrant teenagers and young people adjust to life in the USA through mentoring, special workshops and other support.

The Asian Management Business Association gave the club the "Helping Hands Award" for its work with the Denise Louie Day Care Center, located in the District. The club had built a play area for the center and done other projects.

The first World Citizen Award was given to Fred Noland at a dinner attended by 150 people. (Project started in Phil's year)

The Homeless Committee gave money for a variety of outstanding projects, including an art exhibit with art done by homeless individuals and art materials for daycare centers for homeless children.

The annual spring fundraiser, chaired by Karilyn and Heidi raised a record amount, over \$27,000, was moved to a downtown hotel and was attended by over 350 people.
