**PRESIDENTIAL CITATION** earned for Membership and Rotary Foundation Accomplishments

**Membership:** Total members on 5/1/12: 58

- Men: 32 – 55%
- Women: 26 – 45%
- Persons of color: 25 – 43%
- Members 35 or younger: 9 – 16%
- Retention as of 6/30/12: 91%

**Rotary Foundation:** Every member of our club contributed to the Annual Programs Fund with a minimum \$100 contribution per person in total contributions (\$5,800 for our club)

- 5 new Paul Harris Fellows
- 29 Paul Harris Fellows among current club members – over 50%

**CHANGEMAKER AWARD** earned for accomplishments in the Six Avenues of Service

(6) Rotary First Harvest.

(3) Bill McKay volunteered at girl's orphanage in India. (4) Ray Connell participated in Polio Plus National Immunization Day.
