Absence from Club Meetings

There is no provision for granting attendance credit to a member who is absent

from a club meeting for any of the following reasons:

- 1) Jury duty
- 2) Compulsory attendance at sessions of a state legislature
- 3) Attendance at informal gatherings of Rotarians held on ships
- 4) Addressing another service club
- 5) Military service or National Guard duty

Attendance at RI Meetings

The RI Board has interpreted the Standard Rotary
Club Constitution to

allow a Rotarian to claim credit for two make-ups when attending a Rotary

International meeting (such as a district conference) if the meeting takes place

on more than one day, provided the days claimed for attendance credit fall in

periods during which a make-up would otherwise be acceptable. (RCP 7.060.1.)

Leave of Absence

Clubs should inform members of their provisions to grant temporary leaves of absence, as stipulated in the club's bylaws. (RCP 7.070.)

Informal meetings of Rotarians do not constitute official meetings of their clubs or districts. Consequently, no resolution passed by those present at informal meetings can be regarded by the Board as an expression of the clubs or the districts. (RCP 7.090.)
