NEW FRONTIERS SCHOLARSHIPS

Applications due by Friday, April 4, 2025

<u>Selection Criteria</u>: This is a scholarship for students with educational goals that include "New Frontiers." Our scholarship committee is looking for outstanding individuals who have set a pattern of "wowing" themselves, family members, teachers and friends with above-and-beyond achievements.

Vocational, artistic, academic, community service, research and exploration, economic development, intellectual, and non-profit educational goals are all equally qualified.

The awards are accessible to students in all fields of study and are not dependent on whether the student has been ranked outstanding, average, or struggling in scholarship, athleticism, or teenage leadership.

Scholarships will be awarded to those students who best demonstrate the effort and preparation to be successful in reaching his or her "New Frontier." Examples from previous applications include:

- The first student in the family to attend post-high school education.
- A person who will study and then bring a new activity to the Wenatchee Valley community.
- A student who is entering a field that is totally different from his or her background experience.
- A person who has chosen a field of study for which there is an unmet need and which will make an important difference in the future, whether for few or many.
- Any other "personal frontier" which is new territory that would not have been opened without the student's own enterprise.
- A community (or global) frontier that the student can advance through her/his contributions.

<u>Eligibility</u>: WHS graduates who will become full-time students attending a higher education or vocational institution that is eligible for FAFSA funding. The course must begin within six months of graduation, except for Rotary Exchange students who may defer for their exchange year.

<u>Payment and Use of Funds</u>: Scholarships are payable directly to the institution to pay for tuition and other fees and expenses that the IRS does not classify as income.

2025 Scholarships Structure and Budget:

- The amount of each scholarship will be approximately \$3,000.00.
- The target amount for awards for the 2025 scholarship program is \$6,000.00.
- The scholarships are open equally to all graduating students of Wenatchee High School, without means or other restrictions.

<u>Selection Procedure</u>: A short list of finalists will be selected from the applications, essays and transcripts. The committee will interview these candidates and then make the final selections.

- The dedication and work effort needed to achieve your goals.
- How you have prepared yourself with the necessary skills to succeed in your chosen field.
- How you have faced hard challenges in order to improve your talents.
