Humanitarian projects

Provide sustainable, measurable outcomes that address real community needs.

Vocational training

Improves job skills in a community through educational programs. It also supports teams of professionals who travel abroad to gain knowledge and skills or build the capacity of the community they visit.

Scholarships

Fund international graduate-level study by people seeking a career in an area of focus. Applications for scholars who will begin studies in August, September, or October are due by 30 June.



ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

Global grants support international activities in Rotary's areas of focus

GLOBAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS

Rotary members must be actively involved in all global grants, and all projects must comply with the Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation Global Grants.

Your Project Must

Provide sustainable, measurable outcomes that address real community needs.

- Have a long-term, sustainable impact
- Include activities that <u>align with the goals of one of</u> Rotary's areas of focus
- Have a minimum budget of \$30,000 US
- Address an important need identified by the community
- Strengthen the community's capacity to address its

GLOBAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS

Rotary members must be actively involved in all global grants, and all projects must comply with the Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation Global Grants.

You Must

- Qualify your club or district for global grants every year.
- Actively involve the benefiting community in the project.
- Partner with a club in another country.
- Develop a project plan that includes a budget and a financial management plan.
- Apply for a grant through the Grant Center (MyRotary)
- Stay up-to-date in reporting for all active grants.
- For humanitarian projects and those that involve vocational training teams:
 - Conduct a community assessment before applying and include the results in your application.
 - o Measure progress toward the outcome.



GLOBAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS

At Rotary, we want every grant to demonstrate that we're ethical, responsible leaders who use our donors' money wisely. Rotary's commitment to sound financial management makes it easier for all of us to find donors, partners, and communities that are ready to work with us.



Club Qualification

By qualifying your club each year, you agree to follow our financial and grant management practices.

- 1. <u>Complete a grant management seminar.</u>
 - · Grant Management Seminar (3-hour course), or

- Grant Management Recertification (30-minute course each year)
- 2. Complete the club memorandum of understanding (MOU).
- 3. Agree to any additional qualification requirements set by your district.
 - The primary contact completes qualification training.
 - A minimum of one secondary contact completes qualification training.
 - The Club Grants Steward completes qualification training.



Community Assessment Principles

- 1. Assessment is completed by local sponsor (Host Club).
- 2. <u>Involve different groups of people in the process.</u>
- 3. District Grant funds can be used to conduct the community assessment.
- 4. <u>Review Areas of Focus Policy Statements to</u> determine.
 - Compliance with Rotary Focus Area Goals
 - Eligible Grant Activities
 - What is needed to implement a successful grant.
- 5. Consider using the IEP 8 Pillars of Positive Peace as a framework for community assessment.



COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT


Making sure that projects meet the local community's needs and build on its strengths makes them more likely to be supported and continued by local community members after the grant has ended.




Using the 8 Pillars of Positive Peace from the Institute for Economics and Peace as a Framework for completing a Community Assessment and establishing a Sustainable Plan.







Most Common Questions Answered During Community-Led **Project Analysis**


- What Pillar/s is the activity aiming to strengthen and why?

- What changes could lead to a more balanced approach, one that helps to incrementally improve all Pillars locally?


