Message from the President



SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

As I write this message, as President of Richland Rotary for 2021-2022, with the COVID-19 pandemic nightmare in the rearview mirror, I recall a quote from Paul Harris from 1935, ***"This is a changing world; we must be prepared to change with it"***. Our Club has had many challenges, yet we worked together and adapted. In many ways we are stronger, more agile, and more determined than pre-pandemic.

The Rotary International theme for 2021-2022 is ***"Serve to Change Lives"***. My theme for this year is ***"COVID-19 Recovery"***. To appreciate our Club's many challenges and changes, we must first look back at the last two and one-half years. It started when our old normal meeting venue, the Hanford House, abruptly closed for renovation in December 2019. We moved and continued our weekly meetings at the SIGN Fracture Care International facilities for several months, until the COVID-19 Stay Home Stay Safe Order was mandated in March 2020.

Our 2020-2021 President, Jim Bauer, transitioned us to weekly meetings on Zoom for a year, until July 2021. During this period, I completed the PETS Training on Zoom. Also, during the spring of 2021, I completed the 2021-2022 Planning Process by listening to our membership with three surveys. These surveys considered: available meeting options, suggestions for improvements, and members' top priority interest areas. The surveys resulted in our current bimonthly hybrid Meeting format starting in July 2021, with in-person meetings at the Holiday Inn and Zoom available to the others. President Elect Jan Jackson is planning to continue surveying our members to keep us aligned with their needs.

Since starting our hybrid Meetings in July 2021, the COVID-19 pandemic has continued to challenge every aspect of our lives, with new variances and new mandate requirements. In September, we purchased equipment to facilitate running a hybrid meeting including video, audio and Zoom capabilities. We also transitioned to DACdb, the new administrative software system which included building a completely new website.

Looking forward with concerns around the world about Russia, Ukraine, and world peace - and with worldwide inflation and energy costs - and with environmental impacts of global warming there are significant challenges and changes ahead of us. But, as Rotarians, we have met several challenges over the years, and we look forward to collaborating with Rotary International to potentially solve at least some of our global challenges, as we have over the years with the near eradication of Polio.

I am incredibly grateful and thankful for the opportunity to serve as the President and member of the incredible ***"Richland Rotary COVID-19 Recovery Team"*** for 2021-2022.

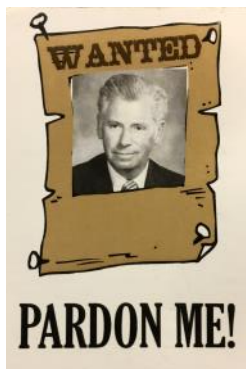

who has throughout their career made the Tri Cities a better place to live both in terms of economy and livability of our community. Members of the Club also work throughout the year with organizations that encourage youth to consider careers in Science, Engineering, Technology, and Math. In recent years Richland Rotary members have been very involved in raising awareness amongst the Tri City youth of benefits of careers in manufacturing. 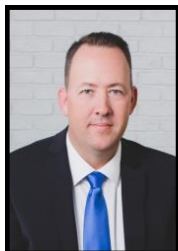
