

OUTREACH: Scott and Wanda Montgomery shared that the MOSAIC CHILDREN'S Museum envisions community outreach programs. Homeschool teachers are excited about this and put this into their curriculum.

EXHIBITS: Bright lightboards are planned and several other toys, such as an air tube and a virtual realty box. All these are work with the hands.

WHERE: The space they found is in the downtown corridor. They do need Rotarians to help. They are working with anyone who will work in the construction phase of this endeavor. They need help to get this going. Scott is looking for help to get the structure done. They will not accept children without an adult present. You will not drop off your child. They have a party room to rent out as well. They will need some donors as well, each of the exhibits costs between 5-10,000 dollars.

Wanda and Scott talked a bit about their past jobs, picking apricots. Wanda corrected Scott and said it was tomatoes that he did not like.

Some of the education will be taught and learned because the exhibits are here to help the children to get prepared for the technology that is upcoming in our world. Scott was recently in a grocery store; he gave the attendant some cash, however, the cashier was challenged figuring out the change.

MOSAIC will address the world we are in right now.

FUNDING: They are currently planning a golf tournament at Wildhorse

Golf course April 1st. This will be their first big fundraiser. They need sponsorship, volunteers, and golfers. All interested, please reach out to Scott or Wanda Montgomery. Are there any questions?

QUESTIONS: Rich Sakai asking to see if the housing area is leased or purchased. Scott said they want a larger space. They would like to fashion it after the Charles Shultz Museum @ 5000 square feet (about the area of a basketball court). Designed to target children with ages ranging from 1-8 years of age.

Bob Hulbert asked, are they looking for the admin structure? They are not open yet.

Patty Arriaga: What do you need? Later today, we are doing sheet rock, insulating, door install. Painting is needed. Murals on the walls. Flooring will go in once they have the money to cover the cost, or to be donated to us. Memberships will be available for a fee, day passes, was asked by Ramon.


And the winner is...
