The sport is fairly new, having been invented in the 1960s. It's played on a field similar to football, with each team attempting an end zone goal, but there's no tackling and running with the Frisbee is not allowed; it must be passed. There are no referees, something that Jason enjoys in that each player must take personal responsibility for how he or she plays the game and to make fair calls "in the spirit of the game." For those of us who have casually tossed a Frisbee around at the beach, Ultimate Frisbee is at another level-much more competitive and challenging, requiring skill and stamina.
