Update: Polio Vaccinations in Gaza



This just in from Mike Crosby, End Polio Now District Coordinator: In Gaza, the first round of an emergency vaccination campaign was successfully conducted in three phases, completed on September 12. The 12-day campaign provided novel oral polio vaccine type 2 (nOPV2) to around 560,000 children under the age of ten, following meticulous planning and coordination. The campaign was conducted by the Palestinian Ministry of Health, in collaboration with WHO, UNICEF,

UNRWA, and partners. Rotary contributed \$500,000. The second round is planned to occur in approximately 4â€"6 weeks' time.
