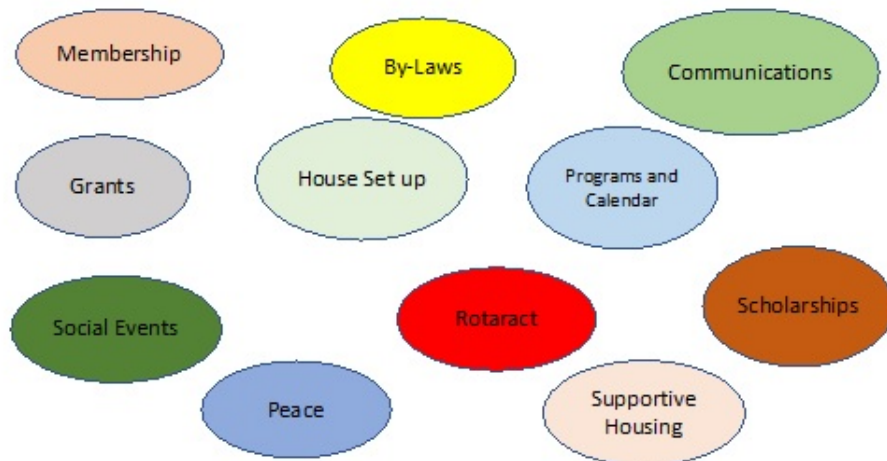
## Past Presidents Program - Reviewing Our Activities
