

We were told that the development of guide dogs in our area is managed through the Guide Dogs of America (GDA) located in Sylmar, California. At their 7.5 acre property they breed dogs that have a propensity to be good guide dogs. As litters are born they are grouped alphabetically and named according to the letter assigned to their litter. The puppy given to Liza and Cory was from the "B" litter of 8 puppies, and was given the name "Bogart".

On January 26<sup>th</sup> of this year, 6 month old Bogart was presented to Liza and Cory to care for and train as a guide dog. We were advised that the GDA is there to guide them and support them throughout the 18 months that Bogart would be in their care. For the first 8 weeks they would have to attend a GDA class. At these Saturday morning get-togethers, the GDA staff would observe how Bogart was progressing and how Cory and Liza were learning the process of training Bogart to be a guide dog. During each of these 8 classes, there would be a new set of instructions. This 8 week training period is referred to as "puppy kindergarten".

Throughout their presentation, Liza and Cory ran Bogart through his paces to demonstrate to our members the guide dog skills that Bogart has already developed.

Although Liza and Cory have not yet completed the 18 month period of training, they are already thinking about what will happen when the 18 month period comes to an end. As part of their contract, if Bogart successfully graduates and is selected to be a guide dog, they must give him up. In such an event Bogart will be provided, free of charge, to a person who GDA believes would benefit from having a guide dog, such

as a blind person, a veteran suffering from PTSD, a child with autism or sometimes a prisoner. We were told that only 30% to 40% of the trained dogs are selected for such assignments.

In the event that Bogart is part of the 60 to 70 percent of dogs <u>not</u> selected for assignment, Cory and Liza would have the right of first refusal to keep him. This decision remains a matter of discussion between Liza and Cory. They have both grown to love Bogart and letting him go will clearly not be easy!
