LAST WEEK: SUPPORTING WOMEN'S BUSINESS STARTUPS: PRESENTATION OF WOMEN'S BUSINESS GRANTS

That's what this week's program was all about. Some time ago, Past President Dave Smith held a meeting with then future President Dawn Smith and member Sonia Kwon to discuss the possibility of awarding grants to startup businesses owned by women. From that meeting came the reality of giving \$1,000 grants to new women's businesses or those in business less than three years.

Last week's program was the culmination of that plan!



The first business to be recognised was **Crescent Yoga**, with co-owners **Carne Meadows** and **Emily Maclean** (left) receiving the grant. They talked about the difficulty of finding a location for their yoga studio. They first looked in South Pasadena, but couldn't find anything they liked. They found Altadena more welcoming, and settled on a location on Lincoln

Avenue. They have several workshops that address different problems that yoga can solve. They have wonderful teachers that conduct the workshops. They can cover shoulder issues and self care. They have been open since September 2023, and are very appreciative of the \$1,000 grant. Their classes are in the mid-morning and late afternoon. They are clearly on the path to success!

Next was **Michiko Lynch**, of **Green Circle SGV** (right). She was enthralled by the Altadena Farmer's Market when she first saw it. She decided to use that healthy food to start a catering business for special events. They provide full service, including all food, silverware, plates, saucers, cups, etc. They are a non-profit company and their goal is to provide catering for events sponsored by non-profit organizations. She said that they would use the \$1,000 to acquire a professional dishwashing machine. This sounds like a very worthy business!

Finally, **Kirstin Smith** of **High Quality Customs** spoke. She happens to be the daughter of Past President Dave Smith (pictured right with President Dawn)! Her business produces high quality custom embroidered and silk screened apparel, mostly t-shirts. She showed us a beautiful blue t-shirt with red hearts and a phrase on the back. She will use the \$1,000 to buy high-tech equipment and hire additional employees. She said it's hard to run a

woman-owned business, but even harder when you're the single mom of a 2 year-old toddler. Kirsten is doing this, however, and looks set to succeed!

It was wonderful to hear about these three women-owned enterprises and to know that we helped them with our \$1,000 grants.

From President Dawn: According to SCORE, as of the 2022 Annual Report from the National Women's Business Council, 1.2 million women-owned firms existed in the United States. These businesses grew 16.7% between 2012 and 2019, as compared to 5,2% growth for men-owned businesses during the same period. Women-owned businesses brought in \$1.8 trillion in revenues, but still is only 4.3% of the total private sector annual revenues. California is ranked 6th in the nation for having women-owned businesses, with most of the owners coming from Generation X (like myself!). In Los Angeles County, 32% of small business owners were women (Los Angeles Business Journal, July 2022).

We are happy to support women business owners in Altadena and look forward to hearing more about the successes of our current and past recipients!
