Patron Protocols

1. The Farnsworth amphitheater has a seating capacity of approximately 700. To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all, attendance will be estimated by providing wrist bands to all patrons at the time of entry, enabling the Rotary Club of Altadena to monitor the number of patrons in the amphitheater. Arriving patrons will be notified when the amphitheater has reached its capacity limit.
2. Wrist bands will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis beginning at 5:00 p.m. the night of the concert.
3. Each patron must wear a provided wrist band.
4. Patrons may reserve seats for their group with blankets, stadium seats, etc. **Please note that the Rotary Club of Altadena and the County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation are not responsible or liable for personal property.**
5. Reserved seats must be occupied (with wrist band) no later than 6:40 p.m., except for up to two benches for Concert Sponsors up until 7 p.m.
6. After 6:40 p.m., personal property holding unoccupied "saved seats" shall be removed, making seats available for patrons on site. Personal property will be placed at the Rotary Table inside the Davies Building for pick up. Items not picked up that evening will be left with Farnsworth Park Lost & Found for pick up during the park's regular hours.
7. Stairs and walkways must always be clear. Sitting on stairs is not permitted. Standing in or placing chairs in walkways is not permitted.
