Susan Shiells brings over 30 years of experience in volunteer recruitment, engagement, and retention. Her journey in community service began with the Pasadena Jaycees in the late 1990s, where she notably drove the 100th Anniversary Jaycee Float down Colorado Boulevard in the 1994 Rose Parade.

Susan went on to serve more than a decade with the Boy Scouts of America, beginning with Exploring at the Greater Los Angeles Area Council. She later became the Activities and Training Director and Senior District Executive for the Lucky Baldwin and Golden Eagle Districts within the former San Gabriel Valley Council.

Her passion for service led her to Skid Row, where she coordinated volunteers at the Los Angeles Christian Health Centers, and then to CASA of Los Angeles, advocating for youth in the child welfare system. During the pandemic, she turned her attention to animal welfare, supporting South LA communities through her work with Stray Cat Alliance.

Now with **School on Wheels**, Susan has come full circle—back to helping children in need, ensuring students experiencing homelessness receive academic support and encouragement.

Susan has been married for 42 years and enjoys cooking, gardening, writing children's books, and spending time in her yard year-round.






August is Membership Month, but our commitment to growth and connection is year-round. When we focus on growing Rotary, we grow our ability to serve, to lead, and to bring lasting change.


