

Requirements of Enrolled Students

- Check in with JobPath Student Success Coach at a minimum 1x per month
- Participate in peer networking sessions, workshops, and events as able
- Commit to working in the field of your training after graduation
 - Provide post-training employment information to JobPath



Eligibility



Enrolled in or scheduled to begin a JobPath sponsored career path

18 Years or Older

Legally eligible to work in the US (Citizen, Permanent Res., DACA)

Have a HS Diploma or HSE (Waived ONLY with PCC IBEST enrollment)

In-State Arizona resident for 1 year

Currently residing in Pima, Santa Cruz, Pinal, or Cochise County at time of enrollment

Meet income reqs (Based on current monthly income per Pima County HUD Guidelines)

Steps to JobPath Enrollment



Step 4

Step 1

Attend information session

Sign up onJobPath'swebsite. Sessionsheld 2x/week

Step 2

Submit New Student Application

-JobPath staff will review for initial eligibility to continue enrollment

Complete Eligibility Forms

Step 3

-Access given for JobPath's Student Portal: **Connect**

-Students upload documentation directly to portal

Initial Interview and Enrollment

-In-depth interview and assessment of student needs and goals

-Enrollment paperwork signed
